



TENANT DIRECTIVE

TITLE: Open Flame Operations

I. References:

- A. State of Maryland Fire Prevention Code, Title 12, Code of Maryland Regulations.
- B. National Fire Protection Association (NFPA), Standard No. 51 B "Fire Prevention in Use of Cutting and Welding Processes".
- C. National Fire Prevention Code/1993, "Welding or Cutting, Calcium Carbide and Acetylene Generators". Sections F-2201.0 through F-2209.0.
- D. This Directive supersedes MTN Tenant Directive 801.1, dated January 15, 1997.

II. Directive Statement:

- A. This Directive prescribes procedures for the control and inspection of open flame operations.
- B. A Permit is required for the conduct of all open flame operations. The Permit may be requested for a period not to exceed 30 days.
- C. "Permit for Cutting and Welding with Portable Gas or Arc Equipment", Form MAA-027, is available through the Airport Operations Office.

III. Procedures:


- A. All portions of the Permit are to be completed and a copy on file with the Airport Operations office prior to commencement of any open flame operation.
- B. A copy of the Permit is to be in the possession of personnel conducting open flame operations and is to be available for inspection by the Chief, MDANG Fire-Rescue Service, Maryland Aviation Administration or his designated representative.
- C. Upon completion of open flame operations the welder or his supervisor will conduct a final inspection of the area.

- D. The airport operations office will be notified of the completion of open flame operations.
- E. Open flame operations are subject to inspection by the MDANG Fire-Rescue Service prior to or during the conduct of such operations.
- F. Any/all welding, cutting, open flame operations conducted without a permit or under unsafe conditions is prohibited.
